Confidential Waste Bags Currently, there is a shortage of confidential waste bags from our supplier, resulting in numerous overfilled bags being encountered by the Porters during collection from wards and office areas.

We kindly request that these bags be filled only to the maximum line indicated on the exterior to prevent them from exceeding a weight that the Porters can safely lift.

Any bags that are overfilled will need to be divided into two, if feasible; otherwise, they may be left until additional bags can be procured.
